

## I Found a Cat

Have you noticed a cat hanging around your yard or neighbourhood? Signs that it could be lost, abandoned or stray include:

- the cat is around at all hours of the day and night
- it looks to be in poor condition or its condition is changing for the worse
- the cat appears to be very hungry, thirsty, or in distress

## MEOW recommends the following:

- 1. If the cat is injured, take it to a veterinary clinic during business hours or to one of the city's 24-hour Emergency Veterinary Clinics. You can also call MEOW at 403-554-4607 to see if we are able to help.
- 2. Provide food, water and shelter. Do not assume the cat will find its way home if you don't feed it. Your kindness may save its life.
- 3. Check for identification: a collar and tag, a tattoo in the ear or a microchip implant. A vet clinic can assist in locating a microchip.
- 4. Speak with your neighbours to see if they know of the cat.
- 5. Put up Found Posters around your neighbourhood at bus stops, mail boxes, area veterinary clinics and convenience stores. Download our customizable Found Flyer template at www.meowfoundation.com/resources/downloads.
- 6. If the cat is friendly and can be petted, try putting a collar on the cat with a note with your name, phone number and a request for the owner to call if this is their cat. This will help you determine if the cat is lost or abandoned.
- 7. Place online notices for no charge on Kijiji.ca, Calgary Herald and Calgary Sun Classifieds.
- 8. Post your found cat on YYC Pet Recovery: https://www.facebook.com/YYCPetRecovery/.
- 9. If you are unable to find the cat's home/owner, call 403-554-4607 or email <a href="intake@meowfoundation.com">intake@meowfoundation.com</a>.
